FROM the PASTOR

Dear Trinity Family,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! In case you were unaware, I am happy to report that, because of an improving COVID-19 situation in Springfield, Trinity is now able to hold an unlimited number of worshipers in our Sunday morning Divine Services. I should say that this is *technically* untrue, because 50% capacity restrictions still apply to gatherings of 500 people or more. However, realistically speaking, we are not going to have 500 people in any one of our services, so for all intents and purposes, we no longer have any capacity limits. After almost eleven months of having to limit the number of our worshipers and hold an extra service to accommodate everyone, we are finally able to take this significant step back to normal. I'm sure that all of you are also relieved that you no longer have to keep your eyes glued to your e-mail inbox on Monday mornings to avoid missing the sign up.

We will continue to offer socially distanced seating on the pulpit side of the sanctuary for anyone who might wish to use it, while the lectern side will be open seating. Masks will still be required, as per the city requirements. And we will change nothing else about our services for now: communion distribution, offering collection, and other procedures will remain the same. Our goal is to take advantage of the loosening restrictions while maintaining as safe and comfortable an environment as possible for everyone. We don't want anything to get in the way of our members returning to church and receiving God's gifts in Word and Sacrament, so we will continue to make changes gradually and carefully.

Up to this point, I have rarely encouraged people one way or the other in regards to whether or not they should attend services. When the pandemic first began, we did not know exactly what we were dealing with, and we didn't have anything that could protect against it other than masks and social distancing. I sympathized very much with everyone who was nervous about attending public worship under those circumstances, especially with those who had underlying conditions that made the virus more dangerous to them. I still do have such sympathy; however, at this point I am ready to be a bit "pushier" in encouraging people to consider returning to church if you have not already. Trinity so far has a track record of keeping everyone completely safe at all of its events. Not a single documented case of transmission has occurred at any of Trinity's services, classes, meetings, or other gatherings. And now that many of our members have been vaccinated against COVID-19, it is even less likely that anyone will catch the virus here. I would encourage everyone

who has not yet come back to our services to strongly consider doing so. At this point, I think your danger of catching the virus here is about equal to that of getting into a car accident if you decide to drive somewhere. The risk is not zero, but it is not very large, and we daily do things (such as driving) that are even riskier to our health than worshipping at church during this pandemic.

Jesus says in John 15:4-5: “Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.” When we avoid attending Divine Services, even for reasons that may be legitimate, we risk causing great damage to our faith in the long run. Abiding in Jesus means being in the places where He has promised to reveal Himself to us; namely, in the preaching of His Word and the administration of His Sacraments. These things happen at church, and that is why it is imperative for Christians to remain connected to the church at all times. Watching services online can be helpful in certain circumstances, but if we become too attached to those online services, then we are allowing them to prevent us from being where God really wants us to be. The technology that we use to broadcast our services was a great blessing to us when the pandemic began, but I would hate for it to become more of a curse, in that it allows our members to stay home and not physically participate in our church fellowship when they are able to do so. If we continue to remain away from God’s church, then we are not abiding in Jesus as we should, and we are preventing ourselves from bearing the fruit that He wants to see from us. More than considerations of physical safety, it is important for us to consider the spiritual effects of prolonged absence from the Divine Service.

I am greatly looking forward to once again seeing our active members who stopped attending Divine Services when the pandemic began. We have missed you very much, and we want to see you again! We will continue to do everything we can to provide a safe environment for everyone who is nervous about the virus spreading at church. Our track record so far has been impeccable, and there is no reason to think that this will change anytime soon. I am very confident that God will continue to protect us from this virus as He has for the last year. May He bless us all with true faith in His Son Jesus Christ, and with the confidence and courage to continue to worship Him and receive His gifts in His house here at Trinity.

A LEGACY OF FAITH

Special Trinity CD of "Music for Praise and Worship" and Lutheran Family Services




